INDIGO

Funded under EU's FP 7 & led by Diginext, INDIGO aims to research, develop & validate an innovative system integrating latest advances in Virtual Reality & Simulation to enhance preparedness & management of complex crises.

INDIGO, based on successful FP 6 forerunner CRIMSON, will improve situational awareness & sharing of a Common Operational Picture (COP) during exercises & actual crises.

Additionally, INDIGO will propose a European emergency symbology reference for 2D/3D maps.



CRISMART Research on Crisis Management Symbology within INDIGO

Extensive Overview of Field:

- Symbols collected from 16 countries/orgs
- Plethora of symbols/sets, even within countries
- Few standardised sets
- Typically large number of symbols in sets
- Symbols often under-utilised
- Some divergence between different sets, i.e. symbols not particularly intuitive or universal
- More often convergence, promising for a shared European symbology set
- Symbol innovation & design




A carefully adopted/devised & harmonised Symbology for Emergency Management

- increases rapid & accurate understanding
- facilitates information-sharing
- improves crisis exercises & training
- improves realtime crisis management:
 - locally;
 - regionally; & in
 - largescale transboundary incidents

Grouping symbols in effective categories is vital-critical that information is interpreted quickly & accurately!

Frame shapes above used in the US emergency management symbology (FGDC) standard & in proposed Australasian set



Recent research shows that in one of the few standardized sets around [US FGDC used by DHS], less than 1% of existing symbols are used (5-15 symbols out of 209)

(Robinson, Roth, and MacEachren, 2010)

INDIGO will propose a smaller practitionerevaluated symbol set tenatively grouped into 3 categories:

Results to Date:

An absolute majority prefer that **symbols**:

- -are in colour (as opposed to b&w)
- -indicate whether information is confirmed or not
- -indicate logged times of information updates & status changes
- -have a clear organisation
